Belle Pond Farm HOA Dues Remain Frozen In 2017!

The Board recently agreed to maintain annual HOA dues at \$100 per housing unit for the seventh consecutive year (invoice in this mailing along with a return envelope).

The invoice amount is due upon receipt and can be paid at the annual meeting on February 8 or mailed back to the HOA. Dues must be paid by March 15 to avoid a late fee.

Late payments lead to many extra volunteer hours for additional trips to the bank, the post office, and extra bookkeeping time. Please pay your annual HOA dues on time. Thank you!

Annual Belle Pond Farm HOA Meeting Scheduled for February 8 at 7:30 p.m.

The annual meeting of the Belle Pond Farm Homeowners Association is scheduled for Wednesday, February 8 at 7:30 p.m. at the Sully District Police Station/Government Center located at 4900 Stonecroft Blvd.

The agenda for the meeting will be to review the 2016 financial results, discuss 2016 activities, review and vote on the 2017 budget, elect the 2017 board of directors, and allow time for an open discussion.

The current board of directors recently announced its willingness to serve again in 2017. The board and the Belle Pond Farm community would like to thank Samantha Kanaga for volunteering as our treasurer over the past several years. Her time and efforts were greatly appreciated. She has been replaced by Gary Chapman who also serves as the HOA webmaster.

The current board leadership remains committed to investing the volunteer hours necessary to enhance the neighborhood with limited HOA board authority, low annual dues, and uncomplicated by-laws and architectural guidelines, all promoting a friendlier environment for all Belle Pond Farm residents.

BPF News and Notes...

Snow Removal – BPF community snow removal is conducted by VDOT and not the HOA. During last year’s blizzard, the board received dozens of calls from angry homeowners asking about the plowing situation. The board is constantly monitoring the plowing conditions of our community roads and will contact VDOT as needed. However, the more calls made to VDOT, the better. If your street or cul-de-sac does not get plowed in a timely manner, please call (800) FOR-ROAD and/or visit www.vdotplows.org to report it. VDOT requests that residents shovel their sidewalks, especially around fire hydrants and bus stops.

Home Improvements – Please send plans for exterior home improvements to the board for approval before you begin your project. The architectural approval form is available on the BPF website or you can simply submit your plans, include color scheme, to Belle Pond Farm HOA, P.O. Box 617, Centreville, VA 20122-0617. You do not need HOA approval to replace an existing fence, deck, or shed.

Home Sales – If you are selling your home, please send your request for a Homeowners Resale Packet, along with a \$100 check payable to “Belle Pond Farm HOA” at least two weeks prior to your settlement. You can download a request form from the BPF web site (www.bellepondfarm.org) and mail to Belle Pond Farm HOA, P.O. Box 617, Centreville, Va. 20122-0617. Ten homes were sold in Belle Pond Farm in 2016.

Pet Owners – The board received numerous complaints last year about pet noise and owners not picking up after dogs. Please be considerate of your neighbors’ property and our common grounds and pick up after your dog. It’s the law in Fairfax County and you could face a fine of \$250 if you are reported. In addition, dogs barking for more than five minutes out of a ten-minute period are in violation of Fairfax County noise ordinance restrictions and could face a fine of \$250 or more.

BPF Common Grounds – The board has signed a five-year contract renewal with Heritage Landscape Services (HLS) for mowing and maintaining the common grounds. The rates remain reasonable and the service has been decent over the past several years. Please contact the board to report any problems with the common areas near you. In addition, Tru-Green will continue to provide spring and fall weed-n-feed treatments to our common ground areas.

Community Improvements

- On the Buggy Whip Drive multi-purpose court, a new basketball rim was installed in 2016. The asphalt on the court is due to be repaved in 2017 and the board has been collecting and reviewing bids.
- The last two sections of split-rail fence marking the north-south boundaries on the gas line are expected to be replaced in 2017.
- The drainage pond along Braddock Road is scheduled for a winter “clean-up” by HLS, which should lead to improved mowing capabilities in the spring/summer.
